The stories are encouraging, but the question foremost in my own mind has to do with why / what’s driving this? Well, here’s some of what I’ve learned through my own conversations with newcomers this fall.



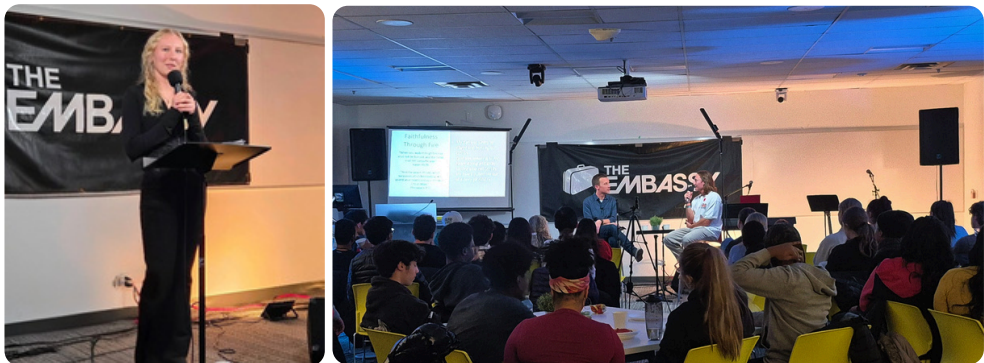

At our kick-off week this past September, I met a first-year student who seemed genuinely glad to have discovered our community. He shared with me that he had recently taken some intentional steps toward Christianity, totally of his own volition. **"So... why faith?" I asked. "The world's gone crazy!" he said, describing the feeling of living in a society that seems to be spinning out of control, lost and confused.** ("And this is part of the problem..." he added, pointing to his cell phone, apparently aware of its power to addict and mislead.)

To quote another minister from a church in downtown Toronto also experiencing some rapid growth among this demographic: "I think COVID-19 gave people a lot of time for introspection, and I think Gen Z is looking around, and they are realizing how anxious, lonely, isolated and fearful they are about the future, and that **secularism, its promises of progress and freedom, simply have not delivered.**"

Indeed. But here’s what does deliver: the good news that God exists and has sent his Son to make himself known — the one who claimed to be “the way, the truth, and the life” (Jn 14:6). **In a culture marked by relativism, self-definition and rampant purposelessness, Jesus’ claims burn like a torch in the night.** Students seem hungrier than ever for direction, truth, and real hope. Pray for us as we do our utmost to point them toward the only one who can satisfy the soul.

THE POWER OF TESTIMONY



A highlight of the semester was our last “Together!” service, an event aimed at bringing our separate Embassy communities all together for a special night of worship, fellowship and teaching. Instead of booking a special speaker or apologist this time, the night featured personal testimonies from a couple of our very own leaders.
